When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs-- in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, “Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o’clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

‘In the last days it will be, God declares,
that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh,
and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,
and your young men shall see visions,
and your old men shall dream dreams.
Even upon my slaves, both men and women,
in those days I will pour out my Spirit;
and they shall prophesy.
And I will show portents in the heaven above
and signs on the earth below,
blood, and fire, and smoky mist.

Refugee Resettlement Ministry Update

Under the guidance of Lutheran Family Services, Christ Church has been mentoring a family from Syria for a little over a year. The family is doing wonderfully. The oldest child, elementary age, has learned English at warp speed and loves math. The middle child will head to Kindergarten next year, and the three year old adores her big sisters. The father is working and takes ESL classes, and the mother is a fabulous cook who also takes ESL classes. They are preparing for Ramadan, a season that lasts from May 17-June 14 this year. They will abstain from eating from sunrise to sunset and engage in prayers in addition to the five daily. The family has repeatedly expressed their gratitude for the people of Christ Church and offers extraordinary hospitality to our ministry team. "Episcopally Speaking"

A closer look at the language and movements of the Episcopal Liturgy.

Pentecost is the great festival that marks the birth of the Christian church by the power of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost means "fiftieth day" and is celebrated fifty days after Easter Sunday. Red is the liturgical color for Pentecost Sunday. The clergy wear red vestments to signify the work of the Spirit. It is also a custom in many churches for the people in the congregation to wear red on the Day of Pentecost as well. We wear red to remind us of the fire of the Spirit. Red recalls the tongues of flame in which the Holy Spirit descended on the first Pentecost.

Confirmation Registration for Rising 8th Grade Students

Confirmation is a sacramental rite where you are affirming your covenant, or promise, from Baptism that was made by your parents. Confirmation is your turn to prepare and renew or strengthen your beliefs. In Confirmation we ask for God's help in our relationship with God and with the Church. There is not a set time in life to be confirmed. Everyone must answer for themselves "I do", "I Believe," and "I will with God's Help." Your church and family provide the support, but it is your decision. We begin to offer confirmation as a class for students during their 8th grade year; however, you can be confirmed at other ages as well. 
